

Marylebone Academy Sixth Form School-Student Agreement 2026-27

To reinforce the partnership between students, their parents/carers and the school all parties will sign an agreement. This agreement will remain valid for the duration of the student's enrolment at Marylebone Academy Sixth Form.

On behalf of Marylebone Academy Sixth Form, teachers will make a commitment that the school will:

- provide a safe, trusting, and stimulating environment;
- do our best to ensure that you fulfil your potential as a learner and as a member of the school community;
- treat you as a young adult and offer opportunities to develop skills beyond the curriculum to improve employability and transferable skills;
- offer a broad and balanced curriculum to students of all abilities;
- encourage you to take responsibility for your actions, feel proud of your achievements, and enjoy being a student at the sixth form;
- assess students' work and provide regular feedback and guidance on how to improve;
- keep you and your parent/carer informed about your progress and general school matters;
- insist that all students observe the school's behaviour and anti-bullying policies;
- set and mark regularly homework and provide a suitable environment for completing said homework on the sixth form site.

Marylebone Academy Sixth Form students will make a commitment to:

- have good attendance and arrive punctually to lessons;
- ensure they embrace the 3 core values (Professionalism, Productivity and Positivity) everyday;
- wear professional dress in accordance with Marylebone Academy Sixth Form uniform expectations;
- bring correct equipment each day;
- work hard, reflect on feedback and keep a growth mindset to ensure they make progress;
- conduct themselves professionally in lessons, around the building and the vicinity of the Marylebone Academy Sixth Form and the main site;
- act as positive role models to young year groups when on the main school site;
- meet all deadlines for homework and coursework assignments;
- participate fully and positively in all lessons, private study, enrichment and personal development opportunities offered by Marylebone Academy Sixth Form;
- form good independent study habits by using the silent study area during free periods in a responsible and considerate manner;
- engage in at least one extra curricular activity/enrichment programme to exploit opportunities to improve skills and develop confidence;
- pass all letters, notes and reports to parents/carers on the day they are issued;

- discuss concerns about learning or the sixth form experience with teachers/form tutors and parents/carers.

With a focus on support and communication, parents/carers agree they will:

- take an active interest in their son/daughter's education and Marylebone Academy Sixth Form experience;
- see that their son/daughter attends school regularly, on time and properly equipped;
- communicate all relevant information that may affect their son/daughter's work or behaviour;
- notify the school if, for any reason, their son/daughter is unable to attend;
- support Marylebone Academy Sixth Form with any associated action taken to ensure their son/daughter is following the behaviour and attendance policy;
- monitor their son/daughters progress, attendance and behaviour through the MCAS application;
- attend parent meetings when requested by the school;
- encourage their son/daughter to seek and utilise opportunities offered to develop employability and transferable skills;
- inform Marylebone Academy Sixth Form of any changes to address or contact information for the student or parent/carer.
